Dedicated to relief work in Third World disaster areas, the heiress has also been a spokesperson for the organisation's End Child Exploitation campaign and has supported its Breastfeeding Manifesto and Make Poverty History campaign. Diana and, in 1996, she invited her one-time close friend to visit the children's cancer wards at a charity hospital in Lahore (left).

their amicable split in February 2007 Jemima has remained close friends with the Love Actually star, as sources reveal she "has a soft spot for Hugh and he makes her laugh," adding, "But she's friends with all her exes."

VLED OVER Jemima met Pakistan cricket star-turned-politician Imran Khan (below right) – 42 to her 21 – in a London nightclub in 1995. The pair were married in a two-minute ceremony, conducted in Urdu, in Paris in the same year and went on to have

two sons, Suleiman and Qasim. After their split in 2004, Imran released a statement saying: "While Jemima tried her best to settle here, my political life made it difficult for her to adapt to life in Pakistan.





Fashion and style

CREATIVE FLAIR With an enviable budget and a model figure, Jemima has always held her own among London's fashion elite and last year she was named the "epitome of modern glamour" by Vogue. Most recently she has completed a stint as guest designer at Parisian label Azzaro, creating a collection of ready-towear clothing and accessories that went on sale at a temporary "pop up" boutique in London last month. "I like comfort and elegance with a bit of glamour thrown in," says the 35-year-old, who was seen stepping out at the launch in an elegant beaded minidress accessorised with a Chanel Union Jack clutch (above). Jemima told fellow partygoers, who included Gwyneth Paltrow and Claudia Schiffer, that she had been "thinking of my friend Queen Rania" while designing the dresses.



Beauty secrets

CROWNING GLORY Without a doubt Jemima's hair is her signature (left). Super-long and impossibly thick, the style has hardly changed since the socialite, then a student, hit the headlines back in 1995 with her marriage to Imran Khan. Today she's gone slightly shorter and is a devotee of the London salon Real Hair, where Elle Macpherson, Gwyneth Paltrow and Laura Bailey also have their tresses tended. Founder Josh Wood gives Jemima gorgeous natural honey and caramel highlights, while his business partner, Belle Cannon, is responsible for her regular blow-dries.

BODY SCULPTING Super-sporty Jemima keeps her slender frame (below) in shape with regular sessions at TenPilates. Instead of taking private sessions she gamely joins the group classes run by TenPilates' founder and trainer David Higgins at his Chiswick and Notting Hill studios in London. A combination of

traditional Pilates performed on a "reformer", and circuit training, the classes promise to help you tone up, whatever your age, and deliver visible results quickly. "It's an effective way to specifically target areas like your abs, bum and arms while working everything from the deep stabilising, or core muscles, to your larger, superficial muscles, strengthening you from the inside out," says David. Jennifer Aniston, Marcia Cross, Courteney Cox and Elizabeth Hurley are all fans of the LA version of these classes, known as Power Pilates.
